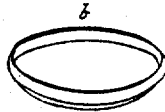

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same containing a description in the words of the said
Jesse Hove himself of his improvement in the manufac-
ture of American wire eye cast Buttons.

It is all to whom these presents shall come. It is known
that Jesse Hove of Waterbury in the County of New
Haven in the State of Connecticut a native citizen of the
United States have invented a new & useful improvement
in the manufacture of American wire eye cast Buttons
& that the following is a full and exact description thereof. This
invention & improvement consists ^{merely} in the application of the cap
shell wire & inlaid work to the wire eye cast button in the
same manner in all respects except the inlaid work: as
they have heretofore been applied to buttons made with solder-
ed eyes. The wire eye cast button for coat or vest or other-
wise is made stamped according to fancy burnished and
edged in the usual manner & fitted to receive the cap or
shell or resin required which is prepared from the same ma-
terials & put on & closed down in the same manner as is
usually done on buttons with soldered eyes. The wire
eye cast button may be prepared for inlaid work by an
indentation in the face by a suitable stamp or die or by a
projection in the face of the mould or by raising the edge by
pressing thro' dies calculated for that object: when thus
prepared any fancy work of brass or ornamental metal
may be inserted & fixed in its place by the burnisher or by
a stamp with ornamental devices impressed upon the
raised edges. I do not claim as my invention the method
of making the wire eye cast button, this has long been
known & used. Nor do I claim as any part of my inven-
tion

tion the method of making or preparing the cap shall remain
invariable or other ornamental words attached to the face of other
buttons as now known and used, but do not claim as my inven-
tion & improvement. The application being to the wire eye
cut button as above described for this I solicit Letters Pat-
